**ABV** 3.8%

**Colour** Blonde

**Style** Modern, citrusy, hoppy

**Sizes** 10ltr, 20ltr polypin, 9gal cask

### Tasting Notes

Citrus aroma full of fresh lemons and spicy orange zest.

The mouth is filled with vanilla malt and left with a long and satisfying bitter finish. An easy-drinking "session beer" with a character that you will find refreshing at any time of year.

### What goes into it?

Low Colour Maris Otter, Wheat and Crystal Malt from Warminster Maltings

Challenger, Celeia, Cascade whole hops from Charles Faram of Malvern

Burtonised water, yeast, finings

## The Brass Knocker story

The name comes from Brassknocker Hill, the steep 1-in-4 incline near the brewery that was once part of The Tour de France!

One of the original beers created by Stuart Matthews back in 2005.

After being shortlisted for the Champion Beer of Britain competition in August 2008, Brass Knocker was, for the second year running, named by CAMRA as one of their "Beers of the Year" in the Good Beer Guide 2009.

**ABV** 4.0%

**Colour** Copper

**Style** Malty Best Bitter

**Sizes** 10ltr, 20ltr polypin, 9gal cask

### Tasting Notes

Full flavoured with a malty aroma leading to cereal malts and fruit on the palate. Smooth and rounded.

Easy drinking and smooth with wide appeal; a classic Westcountry Best .

### What goes into it?

Pale Malt, Crystal, Flaked Maize, Torrefied Wheat Malts from Warminster Maltings

Target, Fuggles, Progress, Challenger whole hops from Faram of Malvern

Burtonised water, yeast, finings

Brewed to a Sixties recipe it evokes memories of a World Cup final in the days when our footie was rosier...

The taste is inspired by the beer the brewery owner grew up with; Glen Dawkins lived throughout his youth very near the much-loved SH Ward & Co Sheaf Brewery of Ecclesall Road, Sheffield.

The brewery has now sadly gone, a victim of needless asset-stripping (don't get him started!), but not forgotten in this, the first new recipe designed by Glen.

## GREEN BARREL

**ABV** 4.0%

**Colour** Amber

**Style** Modern Best Bitter

**Sizes** 10ltr, 20ltr polypin, 9gal cask

### Tasting Notes

Beautifully balanced modern Best Bitter with clean, biscuity malt, gently citrus hints and a long, lightly hoppy and bitter finish.

Fresh, all-natural brew.

### What goes into it?

Pale Ale, Crystal, Wheat Malts from Warminster Maltings

Celeia whole hops from Charles Faram of Malvern

Burtonised water, yeast, finings

## The Green Barrel story

The first Dawkins beer that pre-dates Dawkins Ales!

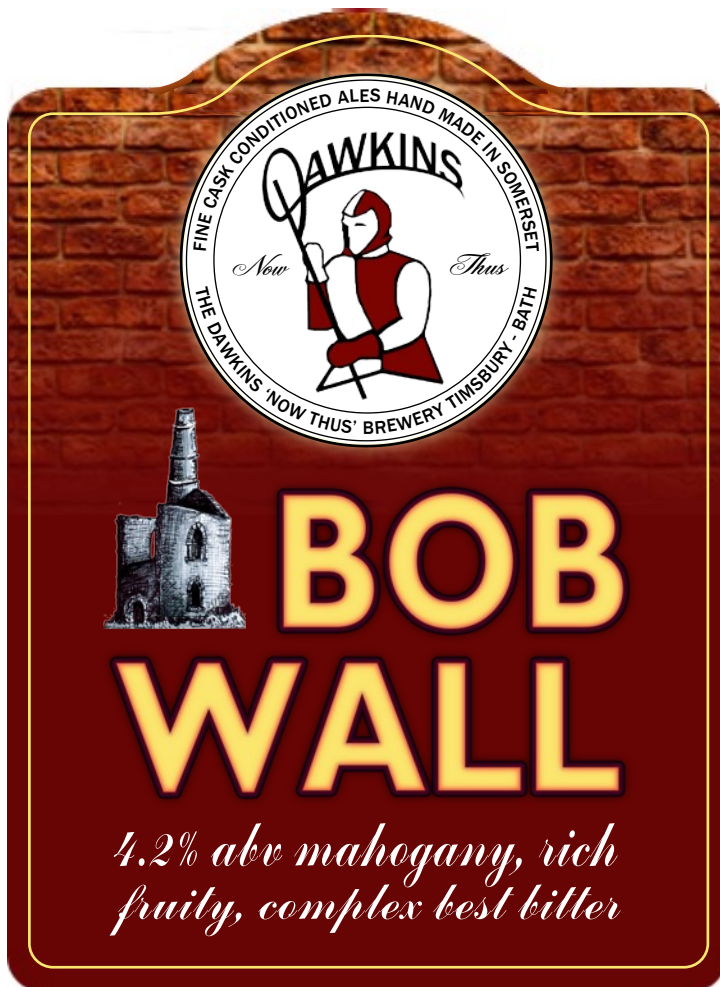
In 2008, the Dawkins Taverns group commissioned Stuart Matthews to brew a beer exclusively for them; Green Barrel was born. Stuart sold the brewery to Dawkins two years later. Originally an organic brew, ingredients supply issues led to a change to the present beer; still all-natural.

The name is ironic reference to owner Glen's unhealthy obsession with Watneys memorabilia and their infamous Red Barrel fizz of the 60s & 70s. Best say no more...

## BOB WALL

**ABV** 4.2%

**Colour** Mahogany

**Style** Best Bitter

**Sizes** 10ltr, 20ltr polypin, 9gal cask

### Tasting Notes

A subtle orange aroma combined with a hint of roast malt. It has a rich and complex malt flavour, with plum fruit qualities, which persist in the mouth and combine with its bitterness to provide a deep and satisfying finish.

### What goes into it?

Maris Otter, Crystal, Wheat and a little Black Malt from Warminster Maltings

Fuggles, Challenger, Goldings whole hops from Charles Faram of Malvern

Burtonised water, yeast, finings

## The Bob Wall story

The name relates to the mining history of the area near the brewery. We can see the remaining parts of the old pit head building from our brewery.

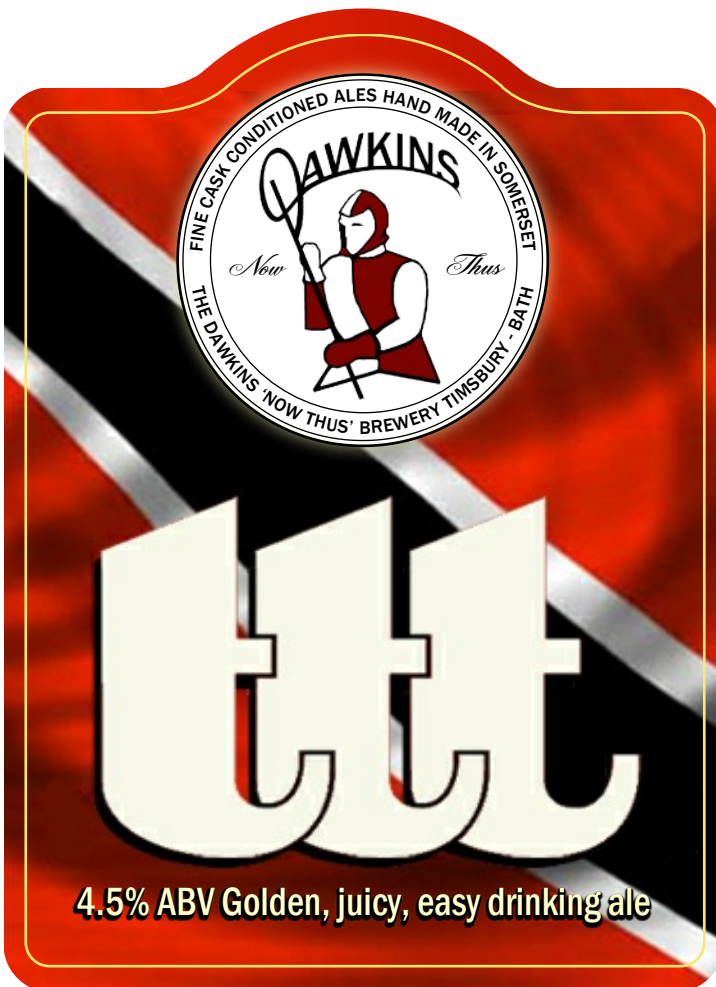
The Bob wall is a stout wall in the pit head's engine room, against which the main piston is attached.

More complex than most Best Bitters, with an intriguing bittersweet flavour, it was one of the original beers in the Matthews Brewing Co portfolio that we took on early 2010.

## TTT

**ABV** 4.5%

**Colour** Golden

**Style** Modern premium ale

**Sizes** 10ltr, 20ltr polypin, 9gal cask

### Tasting Notes

A smooth, easy-drinking and juicy ale with citrus and marmalade tones. Very well balanced by a gently bitter finish.

For 2011, we've altered the brew a little to boost it from 4.2% to 4,5% abv

### What goes into it?

Low Colour Maris Otter, Munich, Torrefied Wheat Malts from Warminster Maltings

Fuggles, Willamete, Celeia whole hops from Charles Faram of Malvern

Burtonised water, yeast, finings

## The TTT story

The first all-new recipe devised by our Head Brewer, Alex Hill.

That's the great thing about a small craft brewery, we can brew the kind of beer we really love, and this one is inspired by one of Alex's all-time favourites.

Originally 4.2%, the new 4.5% version is even more rounded as the touch of extra alcohol adds to the mouthfeel.

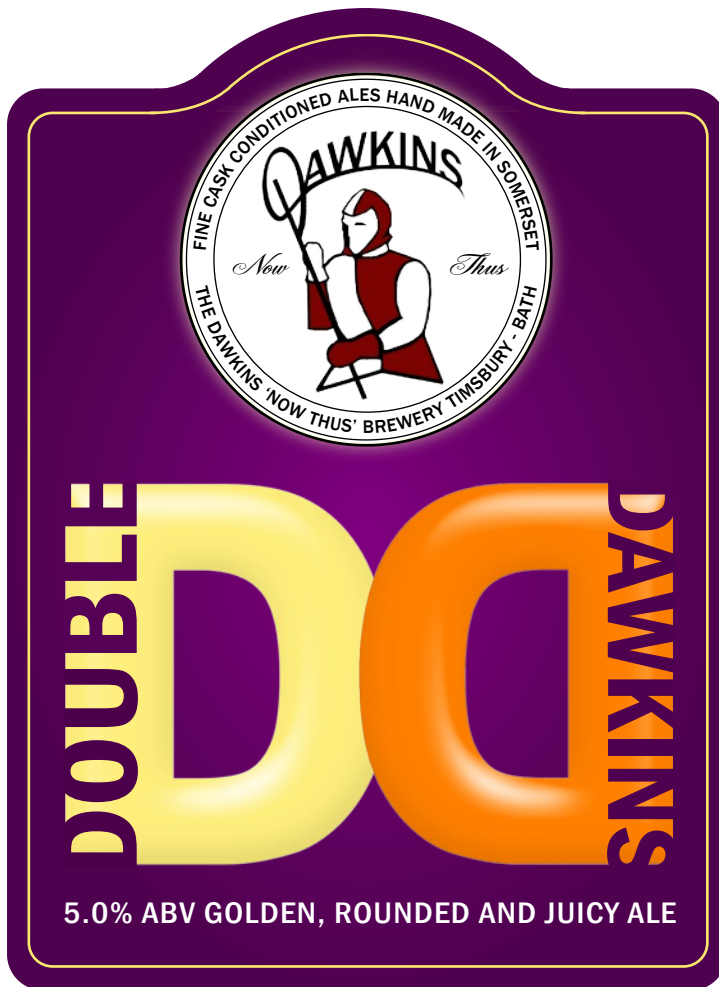
What does T T T stand for?

**ABV** 5.0%

**Colour** Golden

**Style** Modern strong ale

**Sizes** 10ltr, 20ltr polypin, 9gal cask

### Tasting Notes

Golden, juicy and dangerously drinkable with marmalade and citrus tones, well-balanced.

Smooth with a very long, nicely hopped finish.

Pale Ale Malt from Warminster Maltings

Perle and Goldings whole hops from Charles Faram of Malvern

Burtonised water, yeast, finings
